The Homily

The Prayers of the People

Leader I ask your prayers for God's people throughout the world; for our Bishops; for this gathering; and for all ministers and people. Pray for the Church.

Leader I ask your prayers for peace; for goodwill among nations; and for the well being of all people. Pray for justice and peace.

Leader I ask your prayers for the poor, the sick, the hungry, the oppressed, and those in prison. Pray for those in any need or trouble.

Leader I ask your prayers for all who seek God, or a deeper knowledge of God. Pray that all may know God's love.

Leader I ask your prayers for the departed. Pray for those who have died.

Members of the congregation may ask the prayers or the thanksgivings of those present.

Leader Praise God for those in every generation in whom Christ has been honored. Pray that we may have grace to glorify Christ in our own day.

The Presider adds a concluding Collect.

The Presider then says

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence may be kept. Then all say together

**Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done,
and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,
have mercy on us and forgive us;
that we may delight in your will,
and walk in your ways,
to the glory of your Name. Amen.**

The Presider says the absolution and the People respond **Amen.**

People **And also with you.**

The Congregation gathers at the Altar for the Great Thanksgiving.

Presider The Lord be with you.

Presider Lift up your hearts.

People **We lift them to the Lord.**

Presider Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People **It is right to give our thanks and praise**

The people remain standing. The Presider says

It is truly right, and good and joyful, to give you thanks, all-holy God, source of life and fountain of mercy. Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we say:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.**

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

The Presider continues

Holy God, Breath of life and Fire of love: with a mighty wind you brought creation into being, and by a pillar of fire you led your people into freedom.
